

Joshua Brunet

"Children's Book Illustration
Using Colored Pencils & Layers of Oil or Watercolor Washes"
Guest Artist Demo 6:30 pm Monday November 4th at MWC Library



Joshua S. Brunet received his M.F.A. in 2011 from the Hartford Art School at the University of Hartford and has been a freelance illustrator for over fifteen years. He has worked for a variety of magazines, including *Focus on the Family* and *LifeWay Press*. His first children's book, "When Pigs Fly", was published in 2011 by Borderstone Press. Since then, he has illustrated three other children's books. "I'm in Love with a Big Blue Frog", Imagine Publishing, a collaboration with legendary folk trio Peter, Paul, and Mary, and singer/songwriter Les Braunstein. "When Butterflies Cross the Sky: The Monarch Butterfly Migration", Picture Window Books, by Sharon Katz Cooper. "Cat in the Night" Web of Life Children's Books, by Madeleine Dunphy.

Joshua is married with four children and currently resides in Shawnee, OK. He is an Associate Professor of Art at Oklahoma Baptist University where he teaches classes in drawing, painting, and illustration.

Susan Schmidt attended an exhibit at the Mabee-Gerrer Museum of Art in Shawnee last March where she met Joshua. The exhibit of colorful and whimsical characters which Joshua curated included a wide variety of art from several amazing children's book illustrators from across the US. Additionally, Joshua gave the Artist Talk at the reception which convinced Susan to ask him to be our Guest Demonstrator.





As MDAG members, you are in for a real treat to learn more about illustrating children's books. And pick up techniques to save production time and add an extra dimension to your art using fixative spray and layers which can be applied to different mediums such as colored pencils, oils, and watercolors. Let's see what information the professor has to share!

Thank you to last meeting's guest artist: Cindy Van Kley

As part of a 19-day **Bahá'í** religious fast, Cindy is required to eat breakfast before dawn and eat dinner after sunset each day with no water consumed during the day. Cindy decided to try to interpret the readings in her prayers on those days using art. The photo shows one of the many paintings she created in the past during her fasting.

Each day of the fast she readies her paints, selects a "toned" canvas that has a base coat of paint, picks an inspirational quotation or religious passage, sets a timer and then paints for 19 "working" minutes. Somehow knowing that one can only paint for 19 minutes both helps her loosen up and speed up. "You gotta get done" is the explanation Cindy provided. With such a limited time to paint it is necessary to just "let things happen" without demanding perfection of yourself. She says it has really helped her paint faster.



At least fifteen of us gave it a try. Cindy provided all the art supplies and inspirational quotes members and guests needed. Plus, we had the option to try different art mediums that we had not used before. After each painting we read the quote we picked out loud and described how our painting interpreted the quote. Then we passed the list of quotes to the next person and started over.

Section 14.2 of the August 7, 2023 bylaws states:

"NOTE: The winner of the Member's Choice is not eligible to enter again for one month but can enter for Judge's Choice at any meeting. If an artist who has won the previous month brings artwork the following month it must be labeled as ineligible for Members's Choice before members vote." The board has interpreted "the Members' Choice" to mean first place.


