

Just as MDAG is establishing a new home at the MWC Library for our monthly demos and meetings, OKC teens who age out of foster care are also in need of new homes. The program run by Pivot, Inc. started 5 years ago to provide Tiny Little Homes and assistance to teach skills and help teens gain experience in transitioning to adulthood. There are now 26 homes located at 201 NE 50<sup>th</sup> Street with another 15 planned for the coming year. Each 280 to 320 square foot home has one or two

twin beds, refrigerator, 2burner stove, microwave and dining area. Each home is a bit different inside and out and decorated individually.







That's where we come in. As part of MDAG's community service commitment, guild artists will have the opportunity to create original paintings for each tiny home. Susan Schmidt will kick off the project February 6 by showing some of her paintings for the Tiny Little Homes, provide a demonstration and allow members to give it a try. The technique which added a contemporary look to Susan's paintings was shared by motivational corporate speaker and artist Lisa Allen who Susan plans to invite as a future demo artist. The truly addictive technique is

both wild and colorful, perfect for teen audiences and suitable for the modern looking colorful tiny homes.



MDAG has purchased 16x20 inch canvases to hand out at the February 6<sup>th</sup> meeting to artists who commit to painting one or more paintings. Completed painting should be returned to Susan at the March or April MDAG meetings. Susan plans to set up a special display of the collection at the MWC Library before delivery to Pivot.

In addition, MDAG members will be invited to the open house of the new 15 homes when they are completed so we can see some of our paintings on display in their permanent locations before 15 lucky teens move in.

Schmidt is thrilled by the fast pace and abstract drama possible using spray and tube acrylic paints and a few tools. See you at the Feb 6<sup>th</sup> meeting in the "Forum" auditorium at the MWC Library.

front as part of their "Art On The Town" initiative. "

My Animals In Peril" series are small acrylic paintings size 12x12, of endangered animals. To create a focal point for the exhibit, I painted a 20x20 black and white interactive puzzle for mall window-shoppers. "How many of the 16 animals in peril can you name?"

You probably have experienced when Googling one subject, that something else will pop up and lead you astray. That happened when researching the animals. I Googled silhouettes of pangolin (which is an endangered scaly anteater). Luckily my husband identified what I had painted as an armadillo! Such a mistake could have been very embarrassing. Painting with acrylics made it easy to white out the pointed ears and thicken the legs and tail. Voila, Pangolin.

Suzanne Henthorn took over the space in the Penn Square Mall store front in December and displayed her colorful horse and wind-up toy paintings and sculptures. I was told by mall personnel there was lots of space available during Covid and no artists. Unfortunately, not as much space is expected in 2023. But seeking space to exhibit your work is worth the effort. One never knows when a store front, display case, or vestibule might become available.

Send photos of your art and list of paintings (including sizes) with your request for an application to Jill Farrand, the Director of Marketing & Business Development for Penn Square Mall at <a href="mailto:ifarrand@si-mon.com">ifarrand@si-mon.com</a>. I had to provide my own easels for the store front. And I was very careful to use a small amount of Scotch tape to ensure I could cleanly remove the tape and my artist statement from the glass. The mall doesn't sell the art so be sure to clearly show your website or other contact info for potential buyers to reach out.

Bet the other malls have similar opportunities to show your art.

### What is Zoom?

Zoom is the leader in modern enterprise video communications, with an easy, reliable cloud platform for video and audio conferencing, chat, and webinars across mobile, desktop, and room systems. Zoom Rooms is the original software-based conference room solution used around the world in board, conference, huddle, and training rooms, as well as executive offices and classrooms

### Do I need a Zoom account to participate in a meeting?

No; only the person who coordinates/hosts the meeting needs an account.

### How do I download Zoom?

Go to <a href="https://zoom.us/download">https://zoom.us/download</a> and download the app for the device you will be using to participate in the meeting. The first option is for computers.

If you haven't downloaded Zoom when you click on the Zoom URL in the invitation email, you will be prompted to download the app.

### How do I get the information I need to participate in a meeting?

- Each meeting has a unique 9, 10, or 11-digit number called a meeting ID that will be required to join a Zoom meeting
- You will receive an invitation email, created by the coordinator/host, with the date and time of the meeting as well as the Zoom URL and Meeting ID.
   EXAMPLE:

Name of Coordinator/Host is inviting you to a scheduled Zoom meeting.

Topic: XYZ User Group Meeting

Time: Jan 28, 2020 07:00 PM Eastern Time (US and Canada) (different time zones can be selected)

# Reboot your device before participating in a Zoom meeting.

#### Do I need a webcam to participate in a meeting?

No, other participants will not be able to see you but you can listen and speak during the meeting, share your screen, and view the webcam video of other participants.



#### Audio

- Check that your speakers are turned on and the volume in the device you are using is turned up.
- Click on the arrow to the right of the microphone in the lower menu bar and test your speaker(s) and microphone.
- Mute your microphone when entering a meeting.
- You can also press and hold the space bar on your keyboard to temporarily unmute yourself
- You can help prevent feedback by wearing headphones or earbuds.

#### Video

Most webcams will have an indicator light to show it is "on the air." If your light is not on, the camera may not be detected by the computer. The camera must be connected before you start the conference. Unplug the camera (if not built-in) and plug it back into a new USB port if possible. If that fails, restart the computer and/or run the setup software for your webcam.

#### Freezes, Video Lags

Close all programs that are working in the background such as:

- All Cloud backup programs
- Is your anti-virus program scheduled to update/scan during the meeting?
- Have your Tuesday patches been downloaded & installed?

Since everyone can see/hear each other during the meeting:

- Please make sure your home/office phone has been turned off or moved to another room.
- Avoid having "busy" items such as moving ceiling fans in your video.
- Avoid bright lights in the background.
- Does the dog(s) need to be outside?

#### **Recording a Meeting**

All Zoom hosts can record locally to their computer. The recording is saved to the host's documents folder. It is downloaded after the meeting has ended.

### What are the Participant Controls?



Mute Click to mute/unmute your microphone or hold down the space bar. Stay muted to avoid distractions.

Click the up arrow next to the microphone icon to open audio settings

to test your speaker(s) and mic or change their settings.



Stop Video Click to start/stop your camera

If you have a camera but don't want to be 'live' at the meeting click on stop video

Click the up arrow to open video settings where you can change your camera settings.



The meeting coordinator/host can invite attendees.

You are a participant. Click to show a list of other participates at the meeting.

You can also raise your hand, change your display name.


Share Screen of you are giving a presentation, click on this icon to share your screen, open your presentation and give the presentation. After you are finished, click to unshare your screen.

Click to open the Chat panel where you can start or respond to a chat.


Your meeting coordinator/host might ask participants to visually raise their hand to be recognized to ask a question.




Only the host can record the meeting.



Click here to leave the meeting.



Click in the upper right corner to change your view. With full screen, it will be populated with squares containing the participants. You might need to scroll to the right or left to see more participants. Click on Speaker view to best see the speaker.

### How do I download Zoom?

It is possible to use Zoom by just clicking on the invitation link, because it will walk you through downloading the app when you click on the link.

But it takes time and could make you late to the meeting. So, install it ahead of time if you can. Once that's done, open the app on your device and simply click 'on the link in the email invitation. If for some reason the link does not work, you can open the app, click Join Meeting, and enter the Meeting ID provided in the invitation and press Join.

You can download the app for your computer at <a href="https://zoom.us/download">https://zoom.us/download</a> and click the download button and Zoom for Desktop Client. Always be careful when downloading anything that you are on the official site.

On your Android smart phone go to the Google Play app, search Zoom and then press install. For Apple phones and tablets you go to the Play Store to install.

It is a more enjoyable experience to use Zoom on a larger screen. I am not a Zoom expert and you may run into problems, I could help you in advance of the meeting if you call my home phone 405-947-2061 and leave a message.
